We are reaching out to provide an update on the ERP program. We have been hard at work on a number of initiatives, including increasing our program communication transparency and working to make future CRP sessions as productive and tailored to the State as possible.

First off, we wanted to formally welcome Kevin O'Toole, who joined as the new ERP Program Director this past week.

Kevin comes to the State with an extensive ERP background and will be working very closely with state leadership, the PMO team, and ERP agency stakeholders to provide oversight and ensure overall program success.

Prior to joining our team, Kevin led several global ERP implementations and also worked for both SAP and Accenture directly.

Second, in order to make ERP program updates more transparent, we have created an ERP program website.
