Notes for July 1st – Badges and Budgets

The launch of DoIT on July 1st marks the first stage of the IT Transformation program. Though a few agencies with employees will participate via IGA while we work through specific circumstances, the majority of state employees who are serving in an IT role will become part of DoIT on July 1st. Please note the following:

- Employees will receive their new DoIT badges on or before July 1st.
- We have also been receiving questions regarding agency budgets.
 Agencies will retain budgets through this transition. The IT Transformation program will continue to work on funding models into FY17.

Featured FAQ of the Week:

What is the timeline for all of these changes?

Identified IT employees will be transitioned into a single organization on July 1. At that time very little will change, other than the parent organization for these employees. True organizational and structural changes will then be rolled out over the next 18 months. We anticipate it may take several years to transition to the final structure for all units. Throughout this period of transformation, the State's labor relations team will be in contact with the appropriate union representatives for any affected employees to ensure compliance with all timelines imposed by collective bargaining agreements or labor law.
