Working with pilot agency feedback, the ERP Team at DoIT continues to make progress and achieved another milestone in the past week, with the integration of over 650,000 ERP vendor taxpayer identification (TIN) numbers. The team worked with the Office of the Comptroller (IOC) to make this advancement possible. The feature will bring many benefits to authorized ERP users, such as
