

# Illinois Department of Agriculture Modernizes Egg Inspections

The Illinois Department of Agriculture's Egg Inspection Program recently utilized technology to improve the inspection process for day to day regulatory functions. Prior to the fall of 2015, the program had been using an outdated system, largely built in a paper-based system. The program now uses a new mobile web-based system that allows for data to be updated and accessible in real time. More information can be found here.
