On Wednesday, January 31 the State of Illinois' first official government report on blockchain technology was released, following several months of discussion and study. The

Illinois Blockchain Task Force considered the opportunities and risks associated with the technology and determined that there is great potential for improved record keeping and service delivery in the public domain. CMS 100-B Pilot in Process at Three Agencies



The Department of Central Management Services (CMS) announced a limited implementation of the automated CMS-100B, the application utilized for all promotional hiring by agencies in the Executive Branch. The automated application is user intuitive, which should reduce the number of submissions with errors. Currently, the pilot program is being offered to employees of CMS, Agriculture and DoIT only. Upon successful completion, the new system will replace the paper-based system for all employees. Employees in the pilot agencies are invited to access the
